# REPORT OF THE PRIEST-INCUMBENT

During the year 1922, St. Peter's Cathedral congregation has shown signs of great enthusiasm and keener interest in church affairs.

One of the most important steps taken during the year has been the decision to replace the present wooden front of the cathedral, by a more suitable structure in brick as a Memorial to the Late Canon Simpson. The sum of \$10,000 was set as an objective. This amount has been promised and very nearly \$3000 is in the hands of the Treasurer. The congregation must make the effort to start this work in the spring. The sooner a start is made the better, or or interest in the scheme will begin to flag.

On July 2nd, the Archbishop of Nova Scotia administered the Sacrament of confirmation to four males and six females. We pray that they may become devout and useful members of the church.

On July 2nd, Rev. E. M. Malone was also inducted by the Archbishop as Priest-Incumbent of the Living of St. Peter's, to which he had been presented by the Trustees, with the approval of the congregation.

Death has taken several members of our congregation during the year—of one of these, Minnie S. Bulman, we make special mention. She was known for her devotion to St. Peter's and for the deep interest and consistent work which she gave wholeheartedly to the church. For her and for the others who have left us we pray "Rest Eternal grant to them O Lord, and let light perpetual shine upon them!"

Mrs. A. B. Cosh has done the work of organist of St. Peter's during the past year, in the regrettable absence of Mr. L. W. Watson from his post. Her performance of her duties has been marked by such ability and efficiency as has won for her the genuine appreciation of all members of St. Peter's. The improvement of the singing has been commented upon, but there is need of a greater interest on the part of individual members of the choir, if the music is to be kept at a high standard.

The work of the W. A. has been of great value to the Church here and abroad and we pray that its value may be increased.

The Ladies of the congregation have again made a magnificent contribution to the funds of the church by their very successful sale of work in December. They must accept our hearty thanks for their efforts.

The visit of two gentleman from Toronto has done much to stir up the interest of the men of this congregation in the work of the church. They have made a start on the right lines and it seems certain that the result will be in the direction of an improvement in church life, which should make itself felt not only in our own congregation, but throughout the Province.

The church attendance and the number of communions made during the year are signs that there is no need to be despondent about the future of St. Peter's and are a cause of great thankfulness and hope.

It is still our duty to impress on the members of this church that attendance at the week day services of the church should not be left to just a few. Out of every household once every week at least, one member should endeavour to be present at the daily Eucharist. It is here that Spiritual life grows and is deepened.

The attendance at the Sunday School is also a matter for thankfulness. We have lost two teachers during the year, Mrs. Cotton and Mrs. R. F. Acorn. We cannot speak too highly of their work. Other duties claim their time and attention, and in these we hope they will find much happiness. Their places have been taken by Mrs. Birt, Miss M. Gaudin, and Mr. W. Hyndman, to whom we offer our very best wishes for success in this very important department of the church's life and work. Miss Florence Chappell has kindly undertaken the duties of Sunday School Secretary and has given valuable assistance.

The work of St. Peter's Church in 1922, has been one of marked improvement. We "thank God and take courage." The time is coming we feel certain when every member will take his part in the church's work and do it earnestly for the sake of our Lord and Master Jesus Christ.

# CHURCH WARDEN'S REPORT

In submitting our report for the past year we regret we have to acknowledge a deficit in the year's accounts of some \$392.49.

This is an unusual occurrence with us, as we have for many years been able to make income and expenditure balance. But this year exceptional repairs and improvements had to be made. First the Rectory had to be put in order for our Rector, then the Rochford Square House had to be fitted up and a new Heating System installed at a cost of over \$600.00. After Mrs. Tomlins gave up the other end of the house, it was found necessary to put a new furnace in there and do a lot of other repairs to make it rentable.

These amounts were paid by the Hodgson Trust Estate, which left them very little to give to the general expenses of the Church. We hope next year these conditions will be improved.

During the year, the matter of erecting a Memorial to the late Canon Simpson was taken up and it was decided at a congregational meeting, that a memorial should be erected, and to take the form of a brick front and tower to the church.

Committees were appointed for different duties and canvassers solicited subscriptions from members and former members, with the very satisfactory result, that the amount of ten thousand dollars had been promised to be paid within five years.

The design of the memorial selected was submitted by Mr. James E. Harris, architect, and may be seen at his office.

On July 2nd, we had a visit from His Grace, Archbishop Worrell. At the morning service he inducted the Rev. E. M. Malone to the Incumbency of St. Peter's Cathedral, making him the third incumbent since the church opened fifty three years ago. This speaks well for the good feeling existing between the Priest and people of St. Peter's. We feel sure we express the desire and feelings of the congregation in wishing Mr. and Mrs. Malone a long and happy stay amongst us.

After the Induction Service His Grace administered the rite of Confirmation to a number of candidates.

Messrs. Wilkinson and Ormsby of Toronto, had a talk with some of the men of St. Peter's this autumn explaining their method of church work. Following their suggestions, a committee was appointed to make an every-member canvass, for the purpose of getting an increase in envelope holders and contributors. This canvass has been made but the results are not yet known.

A Men's Club was also started by their advice, and has advanced as far as electing Officers but it will take time to tell if it will accomplish the purpose for which it was intended, viz: social companionship and providing a body of men ever ready to perform church work.

We are glad to note the good attendance in the Choir, and also the improvement in the service. This must be gratifying to the choir and organist as well as the congregation, on whose behalf we offer them our sincere thanks.

The ladies of the church are to be congratulated on the magnificent result of their sale and tea, and many thanks are due them for their consideration in passing the proceeds over to the General Fund thereby reducing our debt by one half.

Last March our sexton Mr. Russel Mason resigned, and we engaged Mr. Fred Mc-Rae as sexton in his place. Mr. McRae also took over the care of the Graveyard and has done good work. He is a careful and capable man and we feel sure he will give perfect satisfaction.
