## CHURCH WARDENS' REPORT.

*To the Congregation of St. Peter's Cathedral,—*

Although your Church Wardens have to report an apparent deficit of \$49.58 it must be remembered that this is more than balanced by the \$60.00 interest due from Mrs. Hodgson's legacy, which has not yet been received by the Incumbent, to whom belongs the disposal of it, and who promised last Easter to pay it into the general fund for the expenses of the past year. There is, further, a balance owing from envelopes amounting to \$175.50, of which \$74.90 is considered absolutely good by the Envelope Clerk. It thus follows that, far from being discouraging, the financial showing for the past year should be a matter of satisfaction, inasmuch as our expenditure has been called upon to the extent of \$87.17, not anticipated last Easter, for five months' rent of Rectory, paid upon authority of the congregational meeting held in September last. Had the committee appointed at this meeting to secure additional guaranteed contributions made a canvass and reported, we would have been spared the deficit. As an additional amount of \$112.83 will be required in future for the rectory rent, it will be for the Easter meeting to provide for the same if the action of the September meeting is to be endorsed.

Seven years ago, upon the death of the late Incumbent, certain sums of money lying in the Savings Bank, deposited in his name and drawing a low rate of interest, were upon the request of the Treasurer of the Church (who has remained in office ever since) handed over to him by the ex-ecutors of the Rev Geo. W. Hodgson and deposited in the general account of the Church at the Bank. So long as any of these funds remained unexpended, the Church was

saved interest at the rate of 8 per cent thereupon, as against our overdraft. But inasmuch as it appears that some people can not, or will not understand this saving, your Church Wardens have deemed it proper to pay over the balance on hand of these Trust Loans to the Incumbent. After a loan of seven years, during which time much annual interest has been saved to the Church at the expense of not inconsiderable trouble to the Treasurer, the system of accounts is now much simplified and there should be no further misunderstanding as to our overdraft—the accumulation of twelve years, and amounting to \$876.12.

During the past year the front of the Church has been painted as provided for last Easter, and the grounds at the back of the Church nicely graded and seeded down, the cost being partly defrayed by a parishioner.

An additional policy of insurance has been secured upon the Church buildings and their contents, the time of payment being so arranged that while the premises are now fairly well protected by insurance upon the three years plan, the outlay is equally distributed over the three years.

The policies of insurance upon the Schoolhouse and the Sexton's house expiring during the year have been renewed.

In conclusion, your Church Wardens wish to tender thanks to Mr. Harrison Carvell for his efficient care of the envelope accounts, and, while regretting that other duties prevent his continuing this charge, have much pleasure in reporting that Mr. Frank Cotton has kindly consented to succeed him in the work.
