CHURCH WARDENS' REPORT

At the end of another year your Wardens are glad to be able to report a surplus of income over expenditure to the amount of \$64.88; this is due to the generous response made to the appeal of Canon Simpson for \$250.00 to meet our probable deficit, as the ladies of the Congregation were devoting so much time to patriotic work, it was not possible for them to arrange for a fancy sale. Of this \$64.88 we have paid \$21.17 balance due for work done in the Graveyard and the rest \$43.71 has been paid on account of the Church debt reducing it to \$407.98. By the reorganizing of our light system we are getting a better service and have reduced the cost for \$48.67 in the year 1912 to \$30.00 for the past year, this improvement was paid for out of the Hodgson Bequest.

As the old heating system was getting defective and causing much expense each year for repairs, it was thought better to install a new system, this was done and a guarantee given by the Contractors for its satisfactory working, we regret that the result has not met our expectations, but trust that the Contractors may be able soon to greatly improve it, for this we are also indebted to the Hodgson Bequest.

The spouting round the Church roof was found to be leaking badly and too much worn out to be repaired, it has been replaced with new spouting which is a saving to the walls and foundation; for the cost of this work the Hodgson Bequest has also been responsible.

We are pleased to note the good average attendance of the choir through the year, with the exception of a few Sundays in the holiday season, but we learn that the rehearsals are not well attended, it seems a pity that the Choir can not give one evening each week for practice during the autumn and winter seasons, this would improve our music and be more satisfactory to the Organist and Instructor.

The decoration of the west wall of the Chapel has been finished as a memorial to the late William C. Harris who designed the Chapel and devoted much loving care to its interior adornment without receiving any remuneration; the central picture is the gift and work of Mr. Robert Harris, C. M. G. and Mr. Robert L. Cotton has contributed generously towards the expense of completing the work.

The Rev. H. Scott-Smith having accepted the charge of a Parish elsewhere, severed his connection with this Church in December last. We wish him success and happiness in his new sphere.

We feel sure that the Congregation will join with us in offering our congratulations to Canon Simpson on having completed another year of faithful and arduous work with the hope that he may long be spared to continue his ministrations.

CANON SIMPSON'S REPORT

I have very little to report this year. The Churchwardens have referred to the various improvements made in the church fabric, and the generous response given to the appeal for special subscriptions in lieu of the annual sale.

During the first half of the year I had to be absent a good deal on Prayer Book Revision work, King's College and other committee meetings. In June the University of Bishop's College, Lennoxville conferred on me the degree of D. C. L. "Honoris Causa"

The outbreak of the war disturbed the ordinary routine of our autumn work and we gave up our usual sewing meetings as our members were busy making Red Cross

supplies. Three of our choir, as well as other members of the congregation, are on Active Service their names will be found on the "Roll of Honour" page 4. The Russian authorities asked the Canadian Government to allow Mr. Baines to remain on the Earl Grey for the winter, as consulting engineer, as he had a thorough knowledge of the vessel, being employed on her as electrician while she was building, and was the only Canadian officer who went to Archangel with her.

Three more of our members, who have been connected with the church from the early days, have passed within the veil since our last report. Mrs. J. S. Carvell, Mrs. Fred Beers and Mrs. B. F. Longworth; and three of the younger generation, Mrs. P. C. Corbin, Mrs. Bleasdale and Katie Brady were brought home for burial in our cemetery.

"Grant them O Lord eternal rest,
And let light perpetual shine upon them."

Mrs. Longworth left the church a legacy of \$500 and further sums of \$2000 for the church and \$300 for the Poor Fund, will come to us on the death of her husband. She also left \$300 to the Missionary Society of the Canadian Church, the first legacy of this kind from any of our members, but I hope her example will be followed by others.

Under the instruction of Mr. Harold Morris we have formed patrols of Boy Scouts and Girl Guides. The Scouts are learning to build bridges and other drills, and the Guides are being taught First Aid Work. We hope the present interest of the members will continue with good results.

I regret that ill health during the past seven months has compelled me to be less active than usual in the many works of the church; and as I am still far from well and may be without an assistant for some time I must crave the indulgence of the congregation if I am not able to visit them regularly and fulfill all the other duties devolving upon me.

I have to thank the churchwardens for their very efficient help, the choir for their services, and the congregation at large for the kindness and consideration shown me during the past year.

THE HODGSON BEQUEST.

You will see by the accompanying statement that the church has received \$1950.25 from the Hodgson Estate this year. This does not include the net income from the Rochford Square houses which the church wardens receive direct.

It is frequently asked why it is necessary to make special appeals for funds when all this extra money is coming in? So I wish to explain once more that Mr. Justice Hodgson in his lifetime used to give about \$500 a year to the church—sometimes much more, and if it were not for the legacy we should be that much short annually now. Then there is \$650 for the assistant priest; \$230 for choir training, \$125 for the rectory certain additions to the chapel which Mr. Hodgson desired and about \$400 for very necessary repairs, especially those connected with the heating system, so there is not very much of a balance left.

The management of such a fund as this is a somewhat thankless task. Looking after the investments and collecting the interest entails a great deal of extra work, for which I can ill afford the time, and there is sure to be a certain amount of criticism. I can only administer the estate as I believe the legator desired and the books will be audited by the trustees of the church every year.
