CHURCH WARDENS' REPORT.

ST. PETER'S CATHEDRAL,
Easter, 1906.

We are glad to report that the finances of the church are in a satisfactory condition. Although there was an estimated deficit last Easter of \$85.00, thanks to the special efforts made we have closed the year with a surplus of \$76.00 which reduces our debt at the bank to \$453.62. While the receipts from envelopes have not been so large as usual, there is a gratifying increase in all other contributions. The general collection exceeds the estimate by \$51.00, and is the largest in sixteen years, the mites are \$9.00 beyond the estimate, and every special collection is larger than last year. The rectory has been no expense to the church so far. The taxes of last year were paid by the Girls' Sewing Society, which has also made offerings for papering and painting the interior. The Inspector informs us that we must place a new boiler in the church before next winter, the present one has lasted nineteen years. This will cost about \$200.00 which must be met by special contributions. These we ask for feeling confident that the congregation will respond in the usual cheerful way.
