#### REPORT OF THE RECTOR

During the past year St. Peter's Cathedral has celebrated the Eighty-Fifth year of its existence. We have cause for added Thanksgiving in that the year saw an increase in Baptisms, Confirmations and Communions, and considerable improvement in the offerings of the Congregation both for local needs and mis-

On Sunday, June 13th, which was exactly eighty-five years after the first Services in St. Peter's, special Thanksgiving Services were held at which the Very Reverend W. W. Davis, Canon E. M. Malone, Canon J. T. Ibbott, Reverend Father W. A. Cotton, C. R. Reverend W. G. Hogg, and the Rector assisted. On June 29th, St. Peter's Day, the seventy-fifth anniversary of the Consecration of the Cathedral was observed. As a Thank Offering the congregation provided a new frontal and superfrontal, burse and even, for the Cathedral altar. These were made by the Sisterhood of St. John, the Divine. Other gifts from groups or individuals included an Altar Missal, Candles of various sizes, Altar book and Reading Desk book for the Chapel, Congregational prayer and hymn books, servers' albs and cottas, new superfrontal for All Souls' Chapel which is to be dedicated in January, and practically the whole cost of this has been defrayed by special gifts from parishioners. For these, and all gifts, we are most thankful.

The increased regular giving for local needs and for missions is encourag-

ing. It is a healthy sign in that it displays a common desire that the ministry of the Lord and the Sacraments be provided for all people, both here and elsewhere. Has the time come for a thorough reconsideration of the place and mission that God intends St. Peter's Cathedral to fulfil? Do we, in actual fact, think too much in terms of self-preservation? Or is our aim to expend ourselves so that more and more may share with us that eternal life which is every man's heritage

through Christ and His Church?

There are certain things about which I shall have more to say: Present members of St. Peter's must maintain the inner life of the Church which is the Source of all power, for without Christ we can do nothing. Each one of us, must increase his devotion to Christ and improve his practice of the Catholic Faith. Constant worship, daily prayer, frequent communion, fasting and self-denial, self-examination and confession, the daily offering of the Holy Sacrifice and the offices must not be "things that are practised or available at St. Peter's"; they must be part of your life because you are a Catholic Christian and a member of St. Peter's.

"The primary purpose of the Church is not evangelism, but worship." But both worship and evangelism are essentials of a Christian's commission, and evangelism has for its purpose the bringing of men into obedience to, and worship. ship of, God. Should we not put more clercial manpower and more lay man-power into the claiming of souls for Christ? Two full-time priests are needed to fulfil the priestly and pastoral ministrations that ought to be carried on here and in communities to the east of us; and the laity as well as the clergy need to heed the maxim "It is the duty of the laity to fill the Churches and of the clergy not to empty them."

I would like to express my warm appreciation of all that has been accomplished in the past year, and I acknowledge a deep sense of the spiritual and moral support afforded by the prayers and good works of the active worshippers and workers of the Congregation. To the sick and shut-ins we send affectionate greetings in Christ, assuring them that they are daily remembered at the Altar of God. Nor are we ever separated from the faithful departed of whom we think with affection and for whom we pray that they may attain to the fulness of joy in Christ's eternal Kingdom.

#### REPORT OF THE CHURCH WARDENS

For the first time in the past three years our financial position is better at the end of the year than it was the beginning. There has been no increase in the demand loan which presently stands at \$25,350.00. We started the year with an operating overdraft of \$290.68 and ended with an overdraft of \$52.61 for a gain of roughly \$140.00 In other words, we paid our way in 1954 but only with the help of the endowment income.

The extra-Parochial or Mission account is in a really healthy condition. We were able to look after our assessments plus the expected 10%, make donations to worthy causes totalling \$158.50 and still have a bank balance at the end of the year of \$211.40.

During the past year the Church properties were maintained in proper condition with few extraordinary expenses being experienced. Some necessary repairs were made to the Rectory heating and water system; the Chapel roof saddleboard was replaced; the eastern half of Rochford Square house was rewired and the foundation supports of this property strengthened. In addition to the above a very useful double garage was erected in the Church yard. This was done as a combined operation. The Sexton, Mr. MacKenzie, and Mr. Allen contributed the labour while the Church provided the materials. The total cost of this garage was slightly over \$200.00 and we are most appreciative of the excellent work of Mr. MacKenzie and Mr. Allen.

The spectre of "the front" still hangs over us. Each year brings us closer to the unpleasant reality of this problem and we must be prepared to solve it.

The Wardens commended the efficient and cheerful manner in which the Sexton carries out his duties. He shows a sincere interest and affection in his care of the Cathedral properties and it has been a pleasure to work with him.

Although it has become a habit on the part of the Women's Guild to make a generous donation to Church funds every year the thanks of the Congregation go out to "the Ladies" for the \$900.00 they made available without any strings attached.

Another Every Member Canvass was carried out in November and although the increase, wasn't as large as in the previous year it was still encouraging. As a matter of fact the way in which the Congregation has responded to recent appeals in a truly Christian spirit has been a source of great satisfaction to your Wardens and Vestry and, we are sure to the Rector as well.
