# CHURCH WARDENS' REPORT

We are pleased to be able to again report that our income and expenditure about balance, but this largely due to the assistance we have received from the Hodgson Bequest.

We think it is a matter of thankfulness for the congregation that our clergy have enjoyed sufficiently good health to enable them to maintain the regular services of the church for the past year, and we join in the hope that they may long continue able to do so.

We are glad to say that our effecient Organist Mr. Watson has been sufficiently restored to health to allow him to resume his duties, which we all hope he may be enabled to continue for many years.

We cannot but feel deeply the loss we have sustained by the transference of our estèemed fellow warden Mr. F. E. Dench who with Mrs. Dench took such an active interest in the affairs of the church, always expressing a willingness and desire to assist in whatever was undertaken for its welfare.

The Sexton, Mr. Ernest Barlow, having obtained a more lucrative position in Ottawa, ttendered his resignation, which we accepted, and appointed Mr. Albert Mills in his place; we feel sure that his many years of service in the choir, will be a guarantee of his continued interest in the Church, which will result in a performance of duty satisfactory to all.

Last spring Mr. Dooley was appointed care taker of the cemetery, but unfortunately the history of previous years was repeated, and many complaints came in about the neglect; we therefore recommend that a sufficient sum be vaised by special contribution to engage a man this years for cas many days as will be required to put it in Lood order, and maintain it for the rest of the season.

Clothes presses have been fitted up on three sides of the Surplice Room for the better likeeping of the Surplices and Cassocks.

A Sewerage system also has been installed in the rear of the Surplice Room, and the unsanitary closets at the back door of the Sextons house have been removed, and a small building for the storing of windows has been built in their place.

The roof of the Sexton's house has been re-shingled, and the Bell Tower strength-

The porch connecting the Church and school was underpinned and repaired, and all work seen to be necessary for the preservation of the property has been performed.

# CANON SIMPSON'S REPORT

January 1st, 1913.

My Dear Friends:

During the past year we have lost an unprecedented number of our members; for while there has been only one adult death, we are forty seven fewer than we were a year ago. The continued exodus, especially of our young people, is a cause of great anxiety. No doubt the other congregations in town are affected by it, but we seem to have been particularly hard hit lately. But notwithstanding our losses it is gratifying to find that the number of Communions made is larger than last year, as is the attendance at the daily Eucharist and other week day services. Neither have the Church Funds suffered The envelopes are \$133.00 above what was estimated at the last annual meeting; there has been a very considerable addition to the number of duplex envelope holders, and the offerings for Missions, amounting to \$786.55, are the largest in the history of the Church I sincerely trust that all members of the congregation will, by their increased zeal and devotion, continue to make up for an inevitable loss in numbers.

#### EXTRACTS FROM THE WILL OF THE LATE EDWARD JARVIS HODGSON

The executors are instructed "To pay the same to, or to assign the outstanding personal estate represented by securities therefrom, and to convey the unsold real property to the said James Simpson, upon trust to hold the same for the benefit of Saint Peter's Cathedral aforesaid, and I declare that the said James Simpson shall have power to execute any conveyance or conveyances and therein to associate any one or more persons with himself and so that the said trust estate shall be held for the benefit of the said Cathedral and I declare that this direction shall receive the most liberal interpretation and for greater certainty but not so as to restrict the generality of the foregoing expression that 'the benefit of St. Peter's Cathedral' shall include all work which shall be done to the building thereof by way of enlargement or repairing or rebuilding the same or any annex thereof or for providing anything necessary or advisable therefor, or for the Rectory thereof or for any school or schools connected therewith, or in any way for the support and maintenance of the said Cathedral or the ministrations thereof."

"And Whereas I have power of appointment over certain property and trust estate under the will of my late wife Margaret Matilda Jane Hodgson, now, in exercise of the said power of appointment and of all other powers and authorities in anywise enabling me in this behalf, I do hereby direct and appoint that all such property and trusts estate under the said will of my said wife shall go to the said James Simpson and Charles Edward McKinnon upon the same trusts and for the same ends and purposes in connection with St. Peter's Cathedral aforesaid as are hereinbefore declared of and concerning the proceeds of the real and personal estate of which I shall die seized and

possessed.

### RE HODGSON BEQUEST

As auditors of the Church Accounts we have also examined Canon Simpson's accounts connected with the Hodgson Bequest. As the executors have not been discharged yet, Canon Simpson has only become trustee for the money left by Mrs. E. J. Hodgson amounting to \$8,011.86, and as much of the interest was in arrears he has only received \$300.05 in interest and has borrowed \$112.13 from the capital until the arrears come in.

He has received in interest from the Hodgson Estate \$393.04, and has borrowed a further \$500 on his own note. This makes a total of \$1,310.22 which has all been paid into the church funds as well as a further sum of \$10.00, as will be shown in the Annual Report.

We have examined the Inventory of the furniture purchased at the auction sale at Hillsboro House, including a piano for the schoolroom and certain articles placed in the Sacristy and in the Rectory, and it appears to us that this is quite in accordance with the instructions in the will.
