Report of the Rector

The Rector's report on parish life in 1958 must of course be largely "at second hand. Eight months of the twelve passed during the incumbency of his predecessor; and as he reflects upon this fact, and upon Canon Moffatt's six years of faithful service, the more than thirty years of Canon Malone's leadership, and, beyond that, the many earlier years when Canon Simpson and Dr. Hodgson had the cure of souls in this place, your new Rector is acutely conscious of the appropriateness of the words: "Other men have laboured and ye are entered into their labours."

It was during the last months of Canon Moffatt's rectorship that the history-making first "Island Synod" was held here in Charlottetown. With the Lord Bishop of the Diocese as the Celebrant St. Peter's was the scene of the great Choral Eucharist which opened the first day of Synod business. The beauty and solemnity of this service made a profound impression upon the many delegates from all parts of the Diocese who knelt at our Altar that morning, among them being the one who is now your parish priest.

The challenge of the Church Extension plan was taken up by the Deanery of Prince Edward Island in advance of the rest of the Diocese. St. Peter's accepted the quota of \$25,000 assigned to this parish, which, added to other sizable commitments, made it adviseable to seek professional aid in raising the needed funds. Very soon after my appointment, therefore, it was my rspsonsibility to preside at a Parish Meeting which authorized the Corporation to employ the Wells Organization for a Combined Funds Canvass. The response to this drive has been very encouraging, and if, as I am confident they will be, the many pledges made are honoured over the next three years, the financial strength of the Cathedral will be very greatly increased, so that we shall be able to meet all our obligations at home and in the wider work of the Church.

Much more important, however, is our spiritual strength. This depends upon faithful habits of worship, and above all on faithful and regular use of the Sacraments. There is real cause for concern in the fact that the total number of Communicants at the two Eucharists each Sunday is very small indeed when one considers that there are over three hundred confirmed persons in the parish. As for the week-days, the possibility of having to abandon the ideal of a daily Eucharist in All Souls' Chapel is very real, unless more of our people come day by day to assist the priest, who, of course, is forbidden to Communicate alone. There were no fewer than six services of Ante-Communion during December 1958.

While all this needs saying, it is at the same time true that the people of St. Peter's have in many ways given loyal and devoted service to our Lord and His Church throughout the year. Even during the brief space of four months your splendid co-

operation as we serve Him together as priest and people has been an inspiration and joy to me. My deep appreciation and thanks go to my fellow priests, and to all our congregation of the Cathedral, especially the Church Wardens and Vestrymen, the Choir and their Leader, the members and officers or organizations, and Mr. Barrett, our Sexton. And, on a very personal note, may I say how much it has meant to me and my family to have been welcomed so warmly and treated so kindly during these first four months among you. The people of St. Peter's have made us feel very much at home.

And now let us all go on together as fellow-members of this Cathdral family, praying for one another that we may serve God faithfully; "for we, being many, are one body in Christ, and every one member one of another".

REPORT OF THE CHURCH WARDENS

The year 1958 was indeed a momentous one for our Cathedral family. Early in the year plans were underway for the Synod of the Diocese of Nova Scotia to meet in Charlottetown. This is the first time the Diocasan Synod has met in this Province and many members of this congregation contributed in many ways to the signal success of this historic meeting.

Early in the spring Canon Moffatt announced that he had forwarded his resignation as Rector to the Bishop, and that his resignation would become effective

on 31st July. The necessary procedure was carried out and the Bishop appointed Rev. John Roberts Davies as Rector and Canon of the Cathedral effective the 1st of September. In July a congregational farewell for the Moffatts was held and our warm best wishes follow them in their new life in Port Hope.

Your Vestry recognized that our long neglected rectory was due for a thorough revamping before our new Rector and his family could be asked to occupy it. This was commenced on the 1st of August and continued until mid-October. We trust that the congregation approves the very extensive repairs and redecoration which has transformed our rectory from one of the worst to one of the best in the Diocese.

Early in the year your Vestry reviewed our financial position and took steps to initiate a campaign to increase congregational giving. This took place in May and June. Unfortunately our good intentions were not realized and with the work involved in preparing for Synod and the change in Rectors this campaign was not completed. In August a Ruri-Decanal conference of the Prince Edward Island Deanery resolved on taking a forward step to provide the Diocese with capital funds for church extension and the Wells Organization of Canada Limited was engaged to conduct a Deanery campaign for this purpose. St. Peter's Cathedral was asked to pledge \$25,000.00 to be paid over the next three years and accepted. A congregational meeting in September decided to engage the Wells Organization to conduct a parish canvass to raise the sum of \$66,000.00 over three years. Our success exceeded our fondest hopes and \$78,000.00 was pledged. With this magnificent response your Vestry has high hopes for our future.

Your Vestry is presently engaged in investigating the best solution to our heating system which is not capable of supplying satisfactory service for our needs. We hope to solve this problem in the near future in the most economical and efficient way.

Plans are also underway to provide our Sunday School with modern visual aids for the teachers. A new sidewalk has been constructed along the west boundary of the Cathedral property fulfilling a long required need.

The Wardens and Vestry deeply appreciate the services rendered by Canon Malone and Reverend Mr. Hogg in so many ways and especially during August of last year.

We join with all members of the congregation in extending the warmest of welcomes to Canon Davies, Mrs. Davies, Ann and Peter. Canon Davies was inducted on the 16th of December by our beloved Lord Bishop and we feel sure that under his guidance and leadership St. Peter's will go forward to greater work in God's service in the years ahead.

In conclusion may we sincerely thank all members of the congregation for their inspiring support during the past year.
