CHURCH WARDENS' REPORT.

CHARLOTTETOWN, P. E. I.
EASTER, 1900.

To the Congregation of St. Peter's Cathedral:

We entered upon our duties last Easter with an estimated deficit of \$159.82. It is a satisfaction to us that we are able to present to you the Treasurer's Statements of Accounts exactly balanced. That we are in a position to do so is mainly due to the Priest Incumbent, who made appropriations for certain repairs and supplies, not foreseen last Easter, from offerings placed at his disposal by some members of the congregation.

In addition to the work provided for in the estimates, we have had to expend over one hundred dollars upon repairs to the roof of the church, and other demands.

Had envelope-holders paid in the amounts subscribed by them, we should have been able to report a surplus.

Special offerings apart from those for the current expenses of the congregation, amount to \$1,325.68, and for the latter purpose \$188.33, in addition to \$2,090.08 for current expenses,—a grand total of \$3,604.09.

The sum of three hundred dollars received from the closing of the capital account has been invested as the nucleus of an Endowment fund.
