


# ANNUAL REPORT of St. Peter's Cathedral

FOR THE YEAR 1956



## REPORT OF THE RECTOR

It was not until July that we saw the completion of work on the new Front of the Cathedral and the repair work to the fabric of the buildings, but the long period of waiting received its reward in the general satisfaction of parishioners at what has been erected. We believe the West End to be dignified and durable and to be in keeping with the rest of the Cathedral.

Details of the continued response to the Building Fund will be found elsewhere, but I should like to express my personal appreciation of the generosity of parishioners and friends and to make comment on this effort to raise the necessary \$35,000. The Campaign Committee decided that the appeal should be extended over 3 years (or 36 months) and it looks as though, at the end of 15 months (January 31st), \$20,000 will have been received in cash. This leaves \$15,000 to be raised in the remaining 21 months. Although only one-third of this remainder has been actually pledged, I believe that the whole project can be paid for within the three year period, and I now ask parishioners to set this as an objective.

I would also compliment the parish for having maintained regular contributions to the work of the Cathedral at a high level, and for continuing to give to the Missionary Work of the Church so well that we not only send out 110% of our Mission Apportionment (and give to special appeals as we are able) but also have a few hundred dollars available for Church Extension work in the Deanery or elsewhere. St. Peter's continues its interest in the missions of Georgetown and Souris, and if it proves possible and feasible to extend the work in the latter place I hope we can assist financially and otherwise.

Numbers of parishioners and of ministrations show little variation from previous years. There has been, however, a further increase in the number of Communion made despite the fact that figures for Christmas and Easter were slightly below those of last year.

Sunday Evensong has been poorly attended recently, for which the invasion of television may be partly responsible! Evensong is a wonderful way for anyone to conclude Sunday worship, and certainly those who are sometimes prevented from worshipping on Sunday morning should make special effort to come to Evening Worship so that they do not let the day pass without fulfilling their chief Christian duty and privilege. Do we not often fail to realize the treasures we possess? Other Communion envy us the possession of such a fine liturgical Service as Evensong, but many of us let it pass by with scarcely a thought.

I regret, too, that the A. Y. P. A. has not revived its organization. We miss its assistance in various ways, and its dramatic presentations were always appreciated. We hope for revival before very long; in the meantime Choir, G. A., Servers' Guild etc., provide avenues of service for most of our young people.

During the year we were privileged to have the Lord Bishop celebrate the Eucharist three times, administer the Sacrament of Confirmation, and Bless the New Front. Visitors from whose ministrations we benefitted were (in order of their visits) The Reverend E. B. N. Cochran (St. Mark's, Halifax), the Reverend Canon C. A. Simpson, D.D. (Christ Church, Oxford), the Reverend Father Neville, S.S.F. (London, England), the Reverend Professor W. N. Pittenger, Th.D. (General Theological Seminary, New York), the Reverend Canon E. K. Moffatt (Halifax, now Port Greville, N. S.), the

Reverend J. A. Coombs (St. James' Cathedral, Toronto), the Reverend Professor E. R. Fairweather, Th.D. (Trinity College, Toronto), and the Reverend T. M. Dustan, D.D. (Diocese of Amritsar, India). The Archdeacon and other Clergy of the Deanery have ministered or assisted at St. Peter's. To Canon Malone and the Reverend W. G. Hogg go our warm thanks for constant readiness to assist in a variety of ways.

One of the happiest days of the past year was the 50th Anniversary of Canon Malone's Ordination to the Priesthood. It was a Sunday, and Canon Malone celebrated early and preached at the Choral Eucharist. After Evensong several hundred friends gathered for a Reception in the Parish Hall. Congratulations and several gifts from Diocese, Deanery, from St. Paul's and from St. Peter's were rendered for Canon Malone on this Golden Jubilee.

I thank all organizations for their labours on behalf of the Church here and afield, and no one will misunderstand if I make special mention of those whose work is constant and essential and yet too often 'taken for granted'. I refer to people like our Sunday School Teachers, the Ladies who care for the Sanctuaries and Vestments and adornments of the Altars, the Sacristan and the Servers at the Altar, the Organist and the faithful Choir members, and our new Sexton who has made the interiors of Cathedral and Chapel shine as they never shone before!

To the sick and shut in we send affectionate greetings and ask them to pray constantly for us and for the whole Church. For the departed we offer prayer and praise daily, and we sorely miss the visible presence of those departed during the last twelve months. Among them were lifelong members of St. Peter's of whose love for Church and parish there was not the slightest doubt—Mary Katherine Saunders, Hugh Meredith Simpson, Augusta Bryant. May God grant to them, and to all the faithful departed, everlasting light and peace!

To God, of whose only gift it cometh that his faithful people do fine and laudable service, we give the glory for any good works accomplished, and the future we commit into His hands with the prayer "Prosper thou the work of our hands upon us, O prosper thou our handy-work".

### REPORT OF THE CHURCH WARDENS

1956 has seen the completion of "The Front" and your Wardens and Vestry trust the finished product has the approval of the congregation.

When the task of demolishing the old front and the construction of the new was decided upon, it was hoped that the total cost would not exceed \$35,000 and the Canon Malone Jubilee Building Fund set its sights on that amount.

We are pleased to report to you that in addition to the demolition and construction of the front, extra repairs were completed as follows: The north wall of the Cathedral was repointed, the east corner of the Chapel was repaired, the brickwork on the east side of the Cathedral at the choir room was repaired, the foundation on the south side of the Sunday School was repaired and the grounds landscaped. The total bill for this work, including Architects fees, amounted to \$34,393.15.

During the year maintenance expenses were kept to a minimum with necessary repairs being effected as required.

Last summer our Sexton, Mr. Lemuel Allen, resigned, and Mr. Joseph Brown was appointed in his place.

The Vestry Clerk's report shows that we have kept our operating expenses within our income, and paid \$1,000 to the Building Fund.

If the people continue their present giving, and when possible, increase their donations, we should be able to hold and improve our financial position.

It is hoped that pledges for the Building Fund will be completely paid up during the next twelve months. If so, there will be a balance of approximately \$10,000 remaining to be paid in the future, and during the coming year plans should be made to deal with this problem.

Your Wardens are most grateful to the Rector, the members of the Vestry and the Congregation for their kind assistance and support at all times during the past year.
