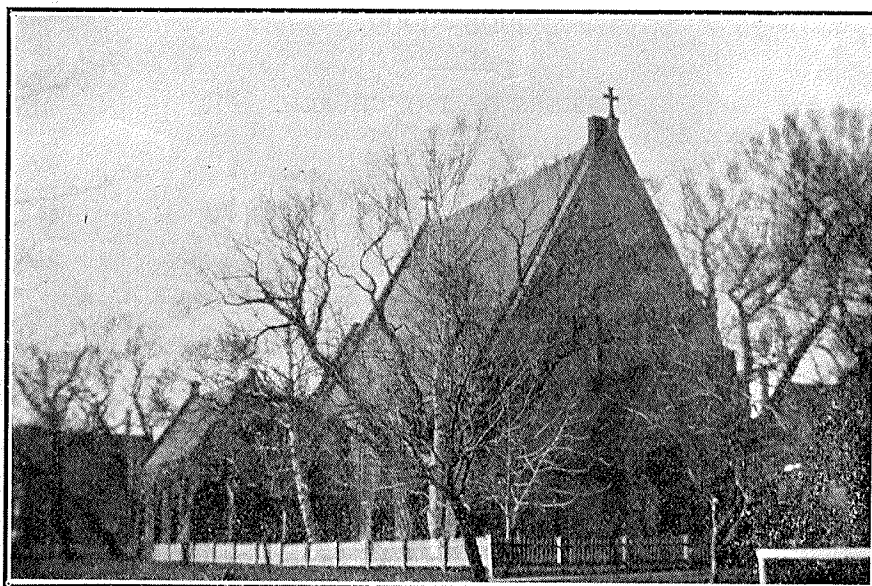

The exterior of the School House and the west end of the Church have been painted, and a new platform laid down in front of the main entrance.

We were grateful for the hearty response of the congregation to the circular which we issued in connection with the twenty-fifth anniversary of the priesthood of the Rev. Canon Simpson. The debt on the Church still remains at \$453.62. Although this amount is not large, it seriously inconveniences the management of the church funds. We earnestly hope that some means may be found to pay off this amount.
