CHURCH WARDEN'S REPORT.

ST. PETER'S CATHEDRAL,

Easter, 1907.

In submitting our reports for the past year we think it a cause of congratulation that we have been able to close the accounts with a small balance in our favor notwithstanding the heavy expenses entailed by the new boiler, the total cost of which was \$382.00, but \$353.66 of this was subscribed by the congregation in answer to a special appeal issued by the committee, and if the few remaining subscriptions are paid, the full amount will be covered. We have to thank the ladies of the congregation for a contribution of \$200.83 towards other necessary repairs, etc., and the Sunday School for \$25.00 towards rectory expenses. Although the rectory has been in use for two years and a half now, it has not yet made any demand upon the general fund of the church. The exterior of the rectory ought to be repainted this Spring, and the schools and front of the church also require like attention. While we have succeeded this year in meeting all our liabilities without increasing our debt we think it our duty to call your attention to the very decided annual shrinkage in contributions from envelopes, which for the last three years has amounted to about \$100.00 a year. We hope that members of the congregation who are not Envelope Holders will help us to counteract this defect, and that others may see their way to increase their present contributions.
