REPORT OF THE PRIEST INCUMBENT

We are now in the third year of war; up to the present we have only suffered very minor and inconvenient restrictions. Before this struggle reaches a victorious end, however, we shall be compelled to make greater efforts and sterner sacrifices. Not only will the war effort demand them, but the work of the Church will require them as well.

In spite of the extra activity that the work of the war entails and the opportunity it offers for escape from the more drab and prosaic domestic and religious duties, we are encouraged by the fact that on the whole, our congregation has not failed in its duty to the Church.

Evidence of this is seen in the fact that Church attendance is slightly better, especially at Evensong, that our apportionment has been paid in full, that the sale of work has maintained its high standard of success, and that the work of the church has been carried on as in former years, and this has been done although more than forty of our young men are in the fighting services.

More than passing notice must be paid to the payment of the apportionment in full, for it is an outstanding achievement on the part of the congregation, unique in the records of the past twenty years. The sale of work also has gained success as a result of hard work and real sacrifice; and the financial support which has been given to the work of the Church, is due in no small measure to the unflagging zeal of the Churchwardens, Treasurer and Envelope Clerk under the energetic direction of their Chairman.

During the past year we have been greatly cheered by the visits of brother clergy—Dean Whalley, Archdeacon Harrison, Revds: H. R. Coleman, B. Feam, Gilbert Oliver R. C. A. F., L. Graham, Canon Whalley, Cecil Ford R. A. F., Canon Banks, Dr. Simpson, A. L. Gardiner, Gerald Gregson R. A. F., J. MacMahon and A. C. French R. A. F. have all been kind enough to take part in our services, for which we are very grateful.

His Grace the Archbishop has also visited us and administered the Sacrament of Confirmation.

Besides the usual absences on Synod business, the Incumbent was privileged to hold a mission at All Saints Cathedral, Halifax, from February 9th. to 16th.

Death has taken from us an old and valued friend, Rev. T. H. Hunt D. D. His connection with St. Peter's went back to the days of the first Priest-Incumbent and remained unbroken to the end. May he rest in peace!

We welcome to our midst Rev. J. MacMahon, Priest at Milton, Rev. G. Greenhalgh, assistant priest at St. Pauls and Rev. A. C. French at the R. A. F. and Rev. D. Henderson, Deacon at Georgetown, and pray for their happiness and success in their work.

We commend to our people the Deanery Despatch, a venture in the publication of news of the Church in the Province and of teaching of value to Church people.

We also note in passing that the St. Peter's Cathedral Monthly will start in April on its twentieth year of publication.

The new Hymn Book came into use on "Stir up" Sunday. It is hoped that in time many of the new hymns and tunes will be learned and used.

It is becoming increasingly evident that the young people of the Church must take their full part not only in the work of the Choir, the Sunday School, the W. A. and other departments of our work, but also in the use of the Daily Services from which they should draw their strength and inspiration for duty. We appeal to them to take encouragement from what has been done by their elders in the past and to carry on their work in years to come.

May God bless and prosper our work for Him and His Church in 1942.

REPORT OF CHURCH WARDENS

Your Wardens at the close of an other year present their Report, which they trust will be read carefully and considered by all members of the congregation.

We regret that there is a deficit of \$245.60. However, during 1941, \$200.00 was paid on the coal now in the cellar, so that it can be said that all coal burned in the Fall and up to the close of the year has been paid for. This is as it should be. In former years, at least for some years past, the coal burned in one year has been paid for during the following year.

The Report of the Treasurer shows that the total debt of the Cathedral is \$2792.38. An increase of \$274.95 over the previous year. In this debt is included a balance of \$370.00 due the Campaign Fund. This amount is long overdue by members of the congregation, and on which the Church is paying Bank interest.

As explained to the congregation in the October issue of the Cathedral magazine, it was found necessary for the safety of the Church edifice, and it is hoped also for economy, to install certain Dunham equipment to the Boiler system. This necessitated liability of \$335.00, which is unpaid, but as shown in the accounts, \$76.00 was received towards its payment by special contributions. Outside the above item we believe that all accounts due up to the close of December have been paid.

The new Well continues to be unsatisfactory, as it will not take off the water which seeps in to the cellar of the Church. This entails much unfair labour for the Sexton, who has without complaint pumped the water out with a hand pump. He should not be expected to do this work, and although it is felt by some that an extension of the use of putty clay outside the wall might stop the water, this cannot be assured, and your Wardens recommend that an electrical or water pump be installed before next spring.

Only necessary repairs were done during the year. The Cathedral Hall was painted. The windows and other woodwork of the Cathedral and Chapel require painting, and the roof on the north side of the Hall will probably have to be shingled during 1942. The water spout on the west side of the Cathedral will also have to be renewed.

The sum of \$1100.00 was received from the Trustees of the Hodgson Trust.

The Woman's Guild have the thanks of the Wardens, and, we are sure of the whole congregation for their continued interest and donation of \$500.00 for Church purposes. It is all to evident that an additional income of about \$700.00 is required from members of the congregation to make revenue and expenditure meet. Then what ever sum the Guild donates could be set aside in a fund for special repairs or alternations, which must take place before many years roll by.

At the request of the Chairman of the Cemetery Committee \$100.50 was paid for a Dominion of Canada Bond, which was deposited with the Secretary of the Trustees for safe-keeping.

The congregation is to be congratulated on contributing \$1013.25 for missions, which was a little more than was required to meet the Missionary Apportionment.

Racks were placed at the entrance of the Church for prayer and Hymn Books at a small expense, as Mr. Stanley Bryant kindly contributed his services without cost. We thank him for his services and interest and the good workmanship he put into what he undertook to do for the Church

We wish again to place on record our appreciation of the untiring labours of the envelope clerk, Miss Fairclough.

We also want to place on record our appreciation of the good and faithful services of both Mr. and Mrs. Carr, who have carefully attended to their duties during the year. Many very favourable remarks have been heard in connection with the cleanliness of the Church properties.

We are pleased to note that an increasing number of the congregation contribute regularly. Others who might easily do likewise are urged to do so, and so make easier the work of those they elect as officials of the Church. It should not be necessary for Church officials to spend their time calling on members of the congregation for amounts pledged.

Here we may thank the members of the congregation as a whole for their unfailing support.

Many of our younger members are now in the service of their Country. We trust that when they return they will find that St. Peter's has not only carried on successfully during these days of stress and strain, but has gone forward in the extension of the work of the Church, both at home and in the mission field.

We cannot close this Report without referring to the passing of the Reverend Dr. T. H. Hunt on the 12th. of August, who, through a long connection with St. Peter's as Teacher, Priest and Friend, endeared himself to the members of the congregation. For his great learning and kindly and unassuming manner he will long be remembered.
